OFFICIAL GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA NOVEMBER 8, 2016

To vote, blacken the Oval (●) next to the candidate of your choice. To vote for a person whose name is not on the ballot, manually WRITE his or her name in the write-in section and blacken the Oval (●) next to the write-in section.

Do not vote for more candidates than the number allowed for each specific office. Do not cross out or erase. If you erase or make other marks on the ballot or tear the ballot, your vote may not count.

If you change your mind or make a mistake, you may return the ballot by writing "Spoiled" across the face of the ballot and return envelope. You may then mail the spoiled ballot back to your county board of registrars, and you will be issued another official absentee ballot.

*I understand that the offer or acceptance of money or any other object of value to vote for any particular candidate, list of candidates, issue, or list of issues included in this election constitutes an act of voter fraud and is a felony under Georgia law. * [OCGA 21-2-285(b) and 21-2-383(a)]

**Special Local Option Sales Tax

*Shall a special one percent sales and use tax be imposed in the special district of Burke County for a period of time not to exceed 6 years for raising of an estimated amount of \$30,293,940 for the purpose of (1) funding Road & Bridge Improvements, Recreation Facility Improvements, Airport Improvements, the EOC/911 Center Project, an Animal Shelter, Jail Improvements, EMA Improvements, EMS Equipment, Fire Equipment, Law Enforcement Equipment, Hospital Equipment & Renovations, Development Authority - Development of Westside Industrial Park, and Building Construction & Renovation projects for Burke County; (2) for funding Water Capital Improvements, Sewer Capital Improvements, Stormdrain Capital Improvements, Road & Street Improvements, Recreation Improvements, Building Capital Improvements, and Equipment for the City of Waynesboro; (3) Water & Sewer Improvements, Downtown Facade Project, Capital Equipment and Roads Paving and Sidewalks for the City of Sardis; (4) Repairs to Roof on Old School Building, Water & Sewer Improvements, Major Police Equipment, Community House Improvements, Street & Road Improvements/Beautification and Equipment for the City of Midville; (5) Furnishings, Building Renovations, Installation of Sidewalks and Creation of a Small Park for the Town of Girard; and, (6) for funding for Water and Sewer System Projects, Streets & Drainage Improvements and Equipment, City Hall & Multipurpose Building Projects, Parks & Recreation Improvements & Equipment and Land Acquisition for City of Koyaville; and (7) Water System Improvements for the City of Vidette?
